

1.2 DEFENCE, NATIONAL SECURITY AND TERRORISM

Tejas Mark II to roll out next year

- A more potent version of the indigenous Tejas multi-role combat jet featuring a much greater load-carrying powerful engine, capability and next-generation electronic warfare system is expected to be rolled out next year and its first high-speed trials will start in 2023.
- Tejas Mark II is likely to roll out by August-September of 2022. After that, the first flight will take some time. The first high-speed trial of the jet will start in 2023 and we expect the production to start somewhere around 2025.

Indo-U.S. joint military exercise 'Yudh Abhyas' to begin in Rajasthan on February 8

- The exercise near the India-Pakistan border aims at enhancing cooperation and interoperability between the two armies and will focus on counter-terrorism operations under the United Nations mandate
- The 16th edition of Indo-U.S. joint military exercise 'Yudh Abhyas' will be held in Rajasthan between February 8 and 21.
- The exercise the India-Pakistan near border aims at enhancing cooperation and

- interoperability between the two armies and will focus on counter-terrorism operations under the United Nations mandate.
- As part of military-to-military exchange programmes, U.S. Army troops will be arriving in India on February 5 for the 16th edition of Exercise 'Yudh Abhyas' with Indian Army troops.
- The bilateral training exercise will be conducted at the Foreign Training Node at Mahajan Field Firing Ranges.

Defense (MSME)

- A three-day defence expo, which will see the participation of more than 400 micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs), will be held between March 19 and 21 at the Chennai Trade centre
- The expo is being organised by Swatantra Foundation, a Chennai based policy research and advocacy institution, and the Aerospace Industry Development Association of Tamil Nadull (AIDAT).

Rs 48,000 crore Tejas aircraft deal to be signed

 The government is set to formally seal on February 3 the Rs 48,000 crore deal to procure 83 Tejas light combat aircraft from state-run aerospace major Hindustan Aeronautics Limited for the Indian Air Force.

34 CRPf women personnel join CoBRA force

- 34 Women personnel of the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) on Saturday joined the Commando Battalion for Resolute Action (CoBRA), the elite CRPF component specializing in jungle warfare and counter-Naxal operations.
- The chosen women personnel from the 6 Mahila Battalions of CRPF will undergo a strenuous CoBRA pre-induction training of 3 months.
- The Central Reserve Police Force (cRPF) for the first time inducted 34 women commandos in its elite Commando Battalion for Resolute Action (CoBRA) lunit, which was raised in 2009.

'Yudh Abhyas' begins in Rajasthan

• The 16th edition of the Indo-US joint military training exercise 'Yudh Abhyas' commenced at the Mahajan Field Firing Ranges in the western sector of Rajasthan.

INS Virat

- The Supreme further Court stopped decommissioned dismantling of aircraft carrier INS Virat.
- It served in the British Navy as HMS Hermes from November 1959 to April 1984 and after refurbishment, was commissioned into the Indian Navv.
- The centaur-class aircraft carrier, INS Viraat, was in service with the Indian Navy for 29 years before being decommissioned in March 2017.

China and India Border issue

- The rising footprint of China in India's neighborhood and its attempts to unilaterally alter the status quo along India's disputed borders have created an environment of confrontation and mutual distrust.

PM hands over Arjun Mk-1A tank to Army

The Arjun Mk-1A has superior firepower, high mobility, excellent protection and crew comfort, with 14 major upgrades from Arjun Mk1.It also uses indigenous ammunition.

100th K-9 Vajra

 Chief of Army Staff Gen MM Naravane flagged off the 100th K-9 Vajra tracked selfpropelled howitzer from a production facility of its maker Larsen and Toubro at Hazira near Surat.

ICG ship C-453 commissioned

Coast Guard Ship (ICG) C-453, Indian the 17th of the 18 Interceptor Boats being indigenously built by Larsen & Toubro Ltd., was commissioned in Chennai. ICGS C-453, the 27.80-m-long interceptor boat with a displacement of 105 tonnes and a maximum speed of 45 knots (85 kmph) is capable of undertaking multifarious tasks, including surveillance, interdiction, closecoast patrol and search and rescue.

Indian Navy Ship Pralaya Participates in NAVDEX 21

- The Indian Naval Ship Pralaya reached Abu Dhabi in UAE to participate in the Naval Defence Exhibition (NAVDEX 21) and International Defence Exhibition (IDEX 21) from February 20 to 25, 2021.
- NAVDEX 21 and IDEX 21 is one of the leading international naval and defence exhibitions of the region.

Anti-Tank Guided Missile Systems 'Heling' and 'Dhruvastra'

- The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) successfully carried out joint user trials of indigenously developed Helina and Dhruvastra Anti-Tank Guided Missiles (ATGM) from the Advanced Light Helicopter (ALH) [HAL Dhruv] at the Pokhran deserts in Rajasthan on February 19, 2021.
- Helina is the Army version and Dhruvastra is the Air Force version of the ALH.
- The missile systems have been designed and developed indigenously by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO).

- The military exercise between the navies of both the countries, aims to enhance operational interoperability and overall cooperation among them.
- Indian naval ship INS Talwar and Indonesian Navy's multirole corvette KRI Bung Tomo participated in the exercise.

Indian Army celebrates historic 1971 war victory

- Serving members of India's Armed Forces and war veterans took part in 'Swarnim Vijay Run', an event held by the Indian Army Headquarters Dakshin Bharat Area. The run was held as a part of the year-long celebration of 50th anniversary year of victory in the 1971 Indo-Pak war. The historic military victory is being celebrated with much fanfare all across the country as 'Swarnim Vijay Varsh' (Golden Jubilee Year of Victory).
- Over 700 participants from across age groups ran the under three distance categories - 2km, 5 km and 10 km.
- Col A Krishnaswamy, Vir Chakra, (Retd), a war hero of the 1971 Indo-Pak War flagged off the run, which also saw the participation of war veterans, most of whom are now nearing eighty years of age.

DRDO Skill Development Centre for Fire Safety Training at Pilkhuwa in Uttar **Pradesh**

- Defence Minister Shri Rajnath Singh inaugurated Skill Development Centre (SDC) for Fire Safety Training of Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) through virtual mode on February 22, 2021, at Pilkhuwa in Uttar Pradesh.
- The first of its kind in India facility has been created by Delhi based DRDO laboratory 'Centre for Fire, Explosive and Environment Safety (CFEES)'.

- It is an inter-governmental body within the United Nations system made up of 47 States.
- It was founded in 2006 as a substitute to UN Commission on Human Rights.
- Headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland.
- The General Assembly elected the following 15 members: Bolivia, China, Côte d'Ivoire, Cuba, France, Gabon, Malawi, Mexico, Nepal, Pakistan, Russian Federation, Senegal, Ukraine, United Kingdom and Uzbekistan.

India accounts for 10% of global road crash victims

- India, which has one per cent of the world's vehicles, accounts for 10 per cent of all road crash victims, the latest World Bank report on road safety.
- Hartwig Schafer, World Bank's Vice President for South Asia announced the Indian government in recent years has taken significant steps to address the issues related to road safety.

- The untiring efforts of a 69-year-old man, paralysed below his knees, towards cleaning up Vembanad Lake, have earned recognition from the highest office of the country.
- In this month's edition of this radio programme, Mann Ki Baat, Prime Minister Narendra Modi hailed the commitment of S. Rajappan, a differently abled man from Kaippuzhamuttu, near Kumarakom, Kottayam.

India's youngest female pilot - 25-yearold Ayesha Aziz from Kashmir

- Ayesha Aziz, the 25 -year-old from Kashmir who is the youngest female pilot in the country acts is a source of inspiration and a beacon of empowerment for numerous Kashmiri women.
- In the year 2011, Aziz became the youngest student pilot to get a license at the age of 15 and underwent training to fly a MIG-29 jet at Russia's Sokol airbase the following year.
- She later graduated in aviation from the Bombay Flying Club (BFC) and obtained a commercial license in 2017.

New acting chief of staff at NASA

- Indian-American woman Bhavya Lal was roped in as the Acting Chief of Staff of the US space agency NASA (National Aeronautics and Space Administration).
- Lal brings extensive experience in engineering and space technology, serving as a member of the research staff at the Institute for Defense Analyses Science and Technology Policy Institute (STPI) from 2005 to 2020.
- Lal served as a member of the Biden Presidential Transition Agency Review Team.

K.S.Thimayya in Madikeri

 The President of India (Ram Nath Govind) inaugurated the General Thimayya Museum in Madikeri. The museum has been built at Sunnyside, the former residence of General KS Thimayya.

 Thimayyal served as the Chief of Army Staff from 1957 to 1961, has been renovated and converted into a museum in Karnataka's Kodagu district.

Devaneya Bhavanar 119th Birthday

- The 119th birthday of Devanaya Bhavanar has been celebrated at Aagara Mudhali Tamil programme.
- On 1974, Devaneya Bhavanar appointed as the Director of Tamil Etymology Agra Kugali.

Child rights activist Thomas Jeyaraj dead

 Senior child rights activist Thomas Jeyaraj, who was the founder and director of the Centre for Child Rights and Development (CCRD), died of a massive heart attack. He was one of the first persons in the country to start an organisation that had child rights in its name. He is the founder of THOZHAMAI and it was incepted on 23rd November 2006 as a trust under the Indian Trusts Act of 1882.

The National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) was set up in March 2007 under the Commissions for Protection of Child Rights (CPCR) Act, 2005, an Act of Parliament (December 2005). Serving as the State co-convenor of the Tamil Nadu Child Rights Watch (TNCRW).

- He was born in Sennikulam, Sankarankoil taluk, Tirunelveli district, Tamil Nadu, he studied Tamil under Ramaswami Pulavar and U. V. Swaminatha Iyer and was later patronised by the zamindar of Uttrumalai.

 Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi will lay the foundation stone of Maharaja Suheldev Memorial and development work of Chittaura Lake on 16th February 2021 at through video conferencing. The event in Bahraich, Uttar Pradesh marks the birth anniversary of Maharaja Suheldev.

Maharaja Suheldev

Suhaldev or Suheldev is an Indian king from Shravasti, popularly known to have defeated and killed the Ghaznavid general Ghazi Saiyyad Salar Masud at Bahraich in 1034 CE.

• He is mentioned in the 17th century Persianlanguage historical romance Mirat-i-Masudi.

 Ayesha Aziz, 25, became the country's youngest pilot when she acquired her flying license at the age of 16. Ms. Aziz was given the First Ladies' Award by the President of India in 2018 and figured among the country's top 100 women achievers.

IAEA, Iran agree temporary deal

• Iran held "fruitful discussions" with UN nuclear watchdog chief Rafael Grossi in Tehran. Mr. Grossi, head of the Vienna-based International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA).

21-year-old Jasmine Harrison from UK becomes youngest woman to row solo across Atlantic Ocean

- A British woman, Jasmine Harrison of England has become the youngest woman to row solo across an Ocean.
- Harrison, who is a swim instructor and bartender by profession, traveled 3,000 miles (4,828km) across the Atlantic Ocean in 70 days, 3 hours and 48 minutes.
- Harrison began her journey in Spain's Canary Islands on December 12, 2020 and arrived in Antigua on February 20, 2021.

Indian citizen Kaushik Barua conferred with Royal Order in Cambodia

- The Cambodian government has conferred its national honour to Indian citizen Kaushik Barua, currently the country director of the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) in Cambodia and Laos, for rendering distinguished services.
- Barua has been awarded the national medal by the Cambodian government under the Royal Order of Sahametrei, conferred primarily on foreigners who have rendered distinguished services to the King and the people of Cambodia, according to the website of the United Nations in Cambodia.

U. Ve. Sa., composer of Tamil keerthanas

• The relatively lesser-known face of U.Ve. Swaminatha Iyer (U.Ve.Sa.), the grand old man of Tamil, has drawn the attention of Tamil scholars and musicians. He had composed keerthanas on Lord Muruga at Ilanthai Nagar in Sri Lanka and published them in 1891. Author and vocalist T.M. Krishna has set two of them to music and rendered it on the occasion of U.Ve.Sa.'s 166th birth anniversary on February 19

- Those who are familiar with his autobiography would know that U.Ve.Sa., born into a family of musicians, learnt music from Gopalakrishna Bharathiyar, the author of Nanda Charitram, when he was in Mayiladuthurai.
- Kumarasamy Chettiar was cover various genres, including Oosal, Etcharikkai and Mangalam. The Etcharikkai song was set to raga Saveri by U.Ve.Sa. himself. The book was reprinted again in 1944 by U.Ve.Sa.'s son.

- He was born on February 19,1855.

- Born at Iringolil, Thiruvalla, on June 2, 1939, Vishnu Narayanan Namboothiri taught English at government colleges at Kozhikode, Pattambi, Kollam, Ernakulam, Tripunithura, Chittoor and Thalassery before retiring from service as head of the department at the University College, Thiruvananthapuram.

- The precious salt is extracted from the Salt Range in Punjab which extends along the south of the Potohar Plateau and the north of the Jhelum River. The decision was taken in a meeting with the Intellectual Property Organisation (IPO) Pakistan chaired by Commerce Adviser Razak Dawood.
- Pakistan is fighting a case in the 27-member European Union against India's move to get Basmati rice registered as its product.

 After the resignation of the Congress government of V. Narayanasamy, the Union Territory appears headed for President's rule as the Opposition parties are not keen on forming a government with the election

President's Rule

 Article 356 of the Constitution of India is based on Section 93 of the Government of India Act, 1935.

This is of two types:

- If the President receives a report from the state's Governor or otherwise is convinced or satisfied that the state's situation is such that the state government cannot carry on the governance according to the provisions of the Constitution.
- Article 365: As per this Article, President's

Rule can be imposed if any state fails to comply with all directions given by the Union on matters it is empowered to.

- The President's Rule is initially for a period of six months. Later, it can be extended for a period of three years with parliamentary approval, every six months.
- The 44th Amendment to the Constitution (1978) brought in some constraints on the imposition of the President's Rule beyond a period of one year.
- It was used for the first time in 1951 in Punjab.
 Between 1966 and 1977, Indira Gandhi's government used it about 39 times against various states.
- In the S.R. Bommai case (1994), the Supreme Court of India put forth strict guidelines for the imposition of Article 356.

2.3 GOVT - WELFARE ORIENTED GOVT SCHEMES, THEIR UTILITY

Water supply, Swachh Bharat 2.0 missions for urban areas

- The government would launch a mission to provide universal water supply to areas under all the 4,378 urban local bodies and the next phase of the Swachh Bharat Mission
- focusing on management of sludge, waste water and construction and demolition waste in cities, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman announced in her Budget speech.
- "The World Health Organisation has repeatedly stressed the importance of clean

water, sanitation, and clean environment, as a prerequisite to achieving universal health. The Jal Jeevan Mission [Urban], will be launched. It aims at universal water supply in all 4,378 Urban Local Bodies with 2.86 crore household tap connections, as well as liquid waste management in 500 AMRUT cities,".

- This mission would be implemented over five years with an expenditure of ₹2.87 lakh crore.
- The Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban), which is being implemented by the Housing and Urban Affairs Ministry, would get a second round.
- The Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban) 2.0 would be implemented over five years - 2021 till 2026 - with an outlay of ₹1.41 lakh crore.

PM KISAN Scheme

- PM-Kisan Samman Nidhi Yojana was launched on 24th February 2019.
- Under the scheme, the government has been providing annually Rs. 6000 in three equal installments to all land holding farmers.
- The amount has been transferred directly into the bank accounts of beneficiaries through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) mode.

Scheme

- The government's maternity benefit scheme, or Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana, has crossed 1.75 crore eligible women till financial year 2020.
- Under PMMVY, pregnant Women and under the Ministry of Civil Aviation in 2016. lactating mothers receive ₹5,000 on the birth of their first child in three instalments, after fulfilling certain conditionalities.
- The scheme was announced on December 31, 2016, by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Krishak Bandhu scheme

- Krishak Bandhu scheme has been increased to Rs 6,000 crore from Rs 5,000 crore for the interest of farmers in West Bengal.
- National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM) is a poverty alleviation project implemented by Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India. This scheme is focused on promoting self-employment and organization of rural
- This programme is supported by the World Bank with a credit of \$1 Billion.

• The scheme was succeeded by Deen Dayal Antyodaya Yojana on 25 September 2015.

Jal Jeevan Mission to help revive urban waterbodies

- The urban water supply mission announced in the Budget would include rejuvenation of water bodies as well as 20% of supply from reused water, the Housing and Urban Affairs Ministry.
- The Ministry said there was an estimated gap of 2.68 crore urban household tap connections that the Jal Jeevan Mission (Urban) [JJMU] would seek to bridge in all 4,378 statutory towns. The Mission would also aim to bridge the gap of 2.64 crore sewer connections in the 500 cities under the existing Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT).

Govt targets 1,000 routes under UDAN scheme

 Union Civil Aviation Minister Hardeep Singh Puri announced ministry has set a target of operationalising 100 unserved and underserved airports and starting at least 1,000 air routes under the UDAN scheme.

UDAN Scheme

 Ude Desh Ka Aam Naagrik (UDAN) was launched as a regional connectivity scheme

Health Minister Harsh Vardhan launches Mission Indradhanush 3.0

- The Union Health and Family Welfare Minister Dr. Harsh Vardhan launched the Intensified Mission Indradhanush 3.0, (IMI 3.0) on February 19, 2021, to expand immunization coverage across the country.
- The focus of IMI 3.0 will be on children and pregnant women who missed their vaccine doses during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Mission Indradhanush

 The scheme was launched in 2014 to provide affordable and accessible healthcare to all citizens of the country. It aims to immunise all children under the age of 2 years, as well as all pregnant women, against eight vaccine preventable diseases.



3. GEOGRAPHY

3.1 POLICY ON ENVIRONMENT AND ECOLOGY

A bullet through an Island's heart

- A plan for the sustainable and holistic development of the 680 sq km, fragile Little Andaman Island in the Andaman and Nicobar group has raised the alarm among conservationists.
- The Sustainable Development of Little Andaman Island - Vision Document' is the NITI Aayog's proposal to leverage the strategic location and natural.

Three Zones

- The proposal is pivoted along three development anchors and zones.
- Zone 1 -spread over 102 sq km along the east coast of Little Andaman - will be the financial district and medi city and will include and aerocity, and a tourism and hospital district.
- Spread over 85 sq km of pristine forest, Zone 2, the leisure zone, will have a fim city, a residential district and a tourism SEZ.

New plant species with possible medicinal properties discovered

- Chennai based botanists have discovered a plant species, Hedyotis sithiravaraiensis (Karumthumbai or Senthumbai or Sakkaraithumbai), a critically endangered species of the Rubia-ceae family in Pakkamalai in the Gingee Hills, one of the ranges of the Eastern Ghats.
- The species had been named after its type locality Sithiravarai (Sethavarai), an archaeologically important site, as it has 3,500 year old rock paintings in natural caverns. The etymological meaning of the term is Sithiram (painting) and Varai (hills).

Green Peace Report

 Air pollution claimed approximately 54,000 lives in Delhi in 2020, according to a

- Greenpeace Southeast Asia analysis of cost to the economy due to air pollution.
- Six Indian cities Delhi, Mumbai, Bengaluru, Chennai, Hyderabad and Lucknow feature in the global analysis.

GPR

- Greenpeace India is the Indian branch of the global environmental group Greenpeace, a non-profit NGO, with a presence in 55 countries across Europe, the Americas, and Asia. Greenpeace India has legally registered society in 4 locations with Bengaluru has its headquarters and other branches at Delhi, Chennai, Patna.
- The organization states that it receives 60% of its funding from donors in India.

Red-eared turtle

- It was found in Kerala.
- Scientifically called Trachemys scripta elegans.
- This turtle is considered one of the world's worst invasive species.

Winter pollution on the rise

- The levels of PM 2.5, the most threatening of particulate matter, worsened in 43 of 99 cities whose winter air in 2020 and 2019 was compared by the Centre for Science and Environment (CSE).
- The cities with the worst pollution spikes in 2020 over 2019 include Gurugram, Lucknow, Jaipur, Visakhapatnam, Agra, Navi Mumbai, and Jodhpur. Kolkata is the only mega city in this group.
- 23 of the most polluted cities are from north India. Ghaziabad is the most polluted city in the northern belt.
- Mysuru is the least polluted, followed by Satna in Madhya Pradesh and Kochi in Kerala.



4. ECONOMICS

4.1 NEW ECONOMIC POLICY & GOVT. SECTOR

₹50,000 cr. for National Research Foundation

- Finance Minister Nirmala Sithraraman earmarked ₹50,000 crore over five years for the creation of a National Research Foundation (NRF) an umbrella body that is expected to fund research across a range of disciplines, from science and technology to humanities.
- Ms. Sitharaman had first announced such a foundation in her 2019 Budget speech after it was proposed in a draft of India's New Education Policy (NEP). It NRF will ensure that the overall research ecosystem in the country is strengthened with a focus on identified national priority thrust areas.

e-payments in smaller cities

• The government proposed a Rs.1,500 crorescheme to promote digital transactions in the country, a move that the industry believes will drive adoption of e-payment in smaller cities and spur innovation by fintech firms.

Nirmala Sitharaman quotes Tirukkural

- Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman quoted Tamil poet and philosopher Thiruvalluvar in her Union Budget 2020 presentation. In her Budget sppech, she mentioned Thiruvalluvar's philosophy on "what a good country is".
- She stated five "jewels" required for a "good country" while quoting Thirukkural's 'Piniyinmai Selvam Vilaivinpam Emam Aniyenpa Naattiv Vaindhu' saying, which translates that a country's jewels are these five: without epidemic or illness, wealth, farm productivity happiness and good defence.
- For these five "Jewels", Sitharaman mentioned that the government took a Bharat' and ease

of doing business rankings while adding that national security is the Centre's top priority.

Reserve Bank of India

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) was established on April 1, 1935 in accordance with the provisions of the RBI Act, 1934.
- Management of currency is one of the core central banking functions of the RBI. According to of Section 22 of the RBI Act, the Reserve Bank is the sole authority for issue of currency in India. Though the Government of India issues coins, they are put into circulation only through the RBI. This function is carried out by the Department of Currency Management.
- The RBI was nationalised on January 1, 1949.

TN gets GST compensation

The provisional GST compensation due to Tamil Nadu for FY2020-21 (till November) stands at ₹15,475 crore, according to information provided in the Rajya Sabha.

GST

- Goods and Services Tax (GST) is a federal tax. GST is an indirect tax, imposed on the sale of goods and services. It is implemented throughout the country since July 1, 2017. There will be no distinction between goods and services for the purpose of taxation. GST will be a destination-based tax. This implies that all State GST collected will ordinarily accrue to the State where the consumer of the goods or services sold resides.
- GST Compensation: Due to a shift from origin based to destination based indirect tax structure, some States might face drop in revenue in the initial years. To help the States in this transition phase, the Centre has committed to compensate all their losses for a period of 5 years.

Constitution (101st Amendment) Act, 2016

■ In order to suitably implement the GST legislation, this Act resulted in the insertion, deletion and amendment of certain Articles of the Constitution.

Article 246A: Special Provision for GST

■ This Article was newly inserted to give power to the Parliament and the respective State/Union Legislatures to make laws on GST respectively imposed by each of them. However, the Parliament of India is given the exclusive power to make laws with respect to inter-state supplies. The IGST Act deals with inter-state supplies.

Article 269A: Levy and Collection of GST for Inter-State Supply

 While Article 246A gives the Parliament the exclusive power to make laws with respect to inter-state supplies, the manner of distribution of revenue from such supplies between the Centre and the State is covered in Article 269A.

Article 279A: GST Council

 This Article gives power to the President to constitute a joint forum of the Centre and States called the GST Council. The GST Council is an apex member committee to modify, reconcile or to procure any law or regulation based on the context of Goods and Services Tax in India.

Article 286: Restrictions on Tax Imposition

- This was an existing article which restricted states from passing any law that allowed them to collect tax on sale or purchase of goods either outside the state or in the case of import transactions.
- Present Governor-Shaktikanta Das.

Amazon CEO

 Jeff Bezos, who founded Amazon as an online bookstore and built it into a shopping and entertainment behemoth, will step down later this year as CEO. Bezos will be replaced by summer by Andy Jassy.

GDP growth projected at 10.5% in FY22: **RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das**

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) projected a GDP growth rate of 10.5 per cent for the financial year beginning 1 April. RBI projects GDP at 10.5% in FY22.
- The economy will rebound to 10.5 per cent in the next financial year.
- India was hit hard by the pandemic, suffering the worst contraction in the June quarter, and the GDP is projected to contract by a record 7.7 per cent in the current fiscal ending March 31, 2021. The Pre-Budget Economic Survey predicted a "V-shaped" recovery, that the Indian economy will rebound, with 11 per cent growth, in the next financial year.
- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has held policy rates at 4 per cent in monetary policy committee announcement. This is the first monetary policy announcement after the presentation of the Union Budget on February 1.

Fiscal indicators deteriorated drastically: Finance Commission

- Tamil Nadu's fiscal indicators have deteriorated drastically from 2012-13 to 2018-19 and most borrowings in the recent years have gone to fund its revenue deficit, instead of capital expenditure.
- Tamil Nadu moved from a "revenue surplus" to a "revenue deficit" State after 2012-13.
- A revenue deficit is the difference between the government's revenue receipts and revenue expenditure and reflects that the government's earnings are not adequate to meet its day-today operational expenses.
- Tamil Nadu's Debt-Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) ratio has increased to 22.6% in 2018-19, from 17.2% in 2012-13.
- As per the report, Tamil Nadu's revenue deficit-fiscal deficit ratio has approached 50% in the recent years, implying that most borrowings were being used to finance its revenue deficit.
- Capital expenditure-GSDP ratio has fallen between 2011 and 2019 (except for 2016-17 when the State joined the UDAY scheme)

 The Finance Commissions are commissions periodically constituted by the President of India under Article 280 of the Indian Constitution to define the financial relations between the central government of India and the individual state governments.

Tamilnad Mercantile Bank reports net profit of Rs 180.81 crore

- Stepping into their centenary 12 months, the Board of the Thoothukudi(Tuticorin)-based Tamilnad Mercantile Bank (TMB) has revealed the reviewed outcomes for the quarter ended on December thirty first, 2020.
- The Bank has reported a net profit of Rs.180.81cr, with a growth of 95.64%, when in comparison with the 2019-20 determine of Rs.92.42cr.

FDI to develop infrastructure in Tamil Nadu

- Tamil Nadu accounts for 7% of the FDI that comes into India.
- The Finance Commission also noted that forestry and tourism were sectors with significant potential for the State.

91 lakh guarantees issued till Jan 25 under ECLG scheme

- MSME Minister Nitin Gadkari announced under the Emergency Credit Line Guarantee (ECLG) Scheme, around 91 lakh guarantees have been issued till January 25 this year.
- Under Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme, around 91 lakh guarantees have been issued till 25.01.2021.
- The government has announced several measures under Aatmanirbhar Bharat package to increase availability of credit to the MSME sector which include ₹3 lakh crore collateral free automatic loans for business, including MSMEs under Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme (ECLGS).

Crypto bill being finalised, will be sent to cabinet soon

- Minister of State for Finance and Corporate Affairs Anurag Thakur proclaimed the Rajya Sabha that the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) lack a legal framework to regulate cryptocurrencies which are neither currencies nor securities or commodities.
- In 2018, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) had banned banks from processing transactions relating to cryptocurrency. However, in March last year, the Supreme Court had lifted the ban
- Regulatory bodies like RBI and Sebi etc also don't have a legal framework to directly regulate cryptocurrencies as they are neither currencies nor assets or securities or commodities issued by an identifiable user.

Inflation down to 4.06 %, IIP rises 1%

 Inflation and Deflation - Inflation occurs when the prices of goods and services rise, while deflation occurs when those prices decrease.

Wholesale Price Index WPI

- It is the most widely used inflation indicator in India.
- Published by the Office of Economic Adviser, Ministry of Commerce and Industry.
- All transactions at the first point of bulk sale in the domestic market are included.

• The base year of All-India WPI has been revised from 2004-05 to 2011-12 in 2017.

Consumer Price Index CPI

- It measures price changes from the perspective of a retail buyer.
- It measures changes over time in the level of retail prices of selected goods and services on which consumers of a defined group spend their incomes.
- Base Year for CPI is 2012.

Index of Industrial Production

- The Index of Industrial Production (IIP) is an index that indicates the performance of various industrial sectors of the Indian economy.
- It is calculated and published by the Central Statistical Organisation (CSO) every month.

Money Bills

- Article 110 deals with money bills.
- They deal with 'only' provisions mentioned in Article 110.
- Speaker decides whether a bill is a money bill
- They can be introduced only in Lok Sabha.
- President's recommendation is needed to introduce them.
- It cannot be amended or rejected by the Rajya Sabha.
- President can either accept or reject a money bill but cannot return it for reconsideration.
- No provision for joint sitting of both the houses to resolve the deadlock.

Financial Action Task Force

- Pakistan, which continues to remain on the "grey list" of FATF, had earlier been given the deadline till the June 2020 to ensure compliance with the 27-point action plan against terror funding networks and money laundering syndicates, or face "black listing".
- The Financial Action Task Force (FATF) is an inter-governmental body established in 1989 during the G7 Summit in Paris.
- The objectives of the FATF are to set standards and promote effective implementation of legal, regulatory and operational measures

- for combating money laundering, terrorist financing and other related threats to the integrity of the international financial system.
- Its Secretariat is located at the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) headquarters in Paris.
- Member Countries: it consists of thirty-seven member jurisdictions. India is one of the members.

FATF has two lists:

- Grey List: Countries that are considered safe haven for supporting terror funding and money laundering are put in the FATF grey list. This inclusion serves as a warning to the country that it may enter the blacklist.
- Black List: Countries known as Non-Cooperative Countries or Territories (NCCTs) are put in the blacklist. These countries support terror funding and money laundering activities. The FATF revises the blacklist regularly, adding or deleting entries.
- It meets three times per year.

SEBI

- SEBI is a statutory body established on April 12, 1992 in accordance with the provisions of the Securities and Exchange Board of India Act, 1992.
- SEBI is a quasi-legislative and quasi-judicial body which can draft regulations, conduct inquiries, pass rulings and impose penalties.
- The headquarters of SEBI is situated in Mumbai. The regional offices of SEBI are located in Ahmedabad, Kolkata, Chennai and Delhi.
- A Securities Appellate Tribunal (SAT) has been constituted to protect the interest of entities that feel aggrieved by SEBI's decision.

NABARD Bank

 NABARD Bank allocated 2978 crore fund for Irrigation Project in Tamilnadu.

NABARD Bank

- It is a statutory body established in 1982 under Parliamentary Act-National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development Act, 1981.
- Headquarter Mumbai

Reserve Bank of India (RBI) brings State Bank of Sikkim under its regulatory purview

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has brought State Bank of Sikkim under its regulatory purview, on February 22, 2021.
- Till now, RBI had the right and obligation to function as banker to all the state government except for the state government of Sikkim.
- Now the bank will be regulated by the RBI on a par with other banks, however the bank's ownership structure will not change.

Moody's forecasts 7% GDP contraction for India in FY21

 Global rating agency Moody's has announced India's economy will shrink by 7 per cent in FY21 and revised India's growth estimate for the next financial year 2021-22 to 13.7 per cent from 10.08 per cent earlier. The agency in its earlier estimates had predicted India's GDP to shrink 10.6 per cent in the current financial year.

Eight core industries' output up 0.1%

- The output of eight core infrastructure sectors grew marginally by 0.1 per cent in January, mainly due to growth in the production of fertiliser, steel and electricity.
- The core sectors had expanded by 2.2 per cent in January 2020, according to the provisional data released by the Commerce and Industry Ministry.
- The eight core industries constitute 40.27 per cent of the Index of Industrial Production.

8 Core Sectors

 The eight core industries include coal, crude oil, natural gas, refinery products, fertilisers,

State Bank of India joins 'Liink' blockchain-based payment network of **JPMorgan**

- The State Bank of India has tied up with JPMorgan to use the blockchain technology "Liink" of the US-based bank to speed up overseas transactions.
- With this, SBI has become the first bank in India to go live on the blockchain-based payment network of JPMorgan.



5. SCIENCE

5.1 LATEST INVENTIONS ON SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

Garbage-to-power plant in veggie market gets PM's pat

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi, during his rst Mann Ki Baat address for the year, made a mention of the garbage-to-power plant being commissioned inside the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Agriculture Market in Bowenpally. Vegetable and fruit waste is used to generate power to the extent of 500 units a day and 30 kilos of green manure at the plant.
- This is being done by making use of 10 tonnes of left over market waste. The power generated is being used to light up the market and also run the canteen in the premises enabling the market committee to make substantial savings in power bills.

HAL planning to export light combat air

- Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) was actively looking for exports of the Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Tejas with interest from countries in South East Asia and West Asia and each LCA (Light Combat Aircraft) MK1A jet would cost ₹ 306 crore.
- At Aero India, HAL received the Request For Proposal (RFP) from the IAF for the basic trainer aircraft HTT-40.

Unmanned fighter

- HAL also announced an ambitious futuristic project for the development of an unmanned fighter jet, which would be controlled by a manned aircraft called 'manned-unmanned' teaming and be able to strike deep inside the enemy territory called Combat Air Teaming System (CATS).
- It would consist of CATS Hunter, CATS Warrior and Alpha-S, all of which are unmanned systems and would be controlled

by a manned mother aircraft, a fighter jet, being customised around a LCA and Jaguar aircraft. "We will be ready to fly it in four-five years time and have put in ₹ 400 crore of our own money on the CATS warrior."

 The CATS warrior would be armed and be able to strike deep inside the enemy territory, while the mothership would be in the Indian territory. It would be powered by the HAL engine that was powering pilotless target aircraft Lakshya.

ISRO to launch PSLV-C51 on February 28 with 1 Brazil & 20 Indian satellites onboard

- India's first space mission of 2021, the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) announcef that it would launch 21 satellites from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre (SDSC) in Sriharikota on February 28, subject to weather conditions. Onboard the PSLV-C51 will be Amazonia-1 of Brazil as the primary satellite along with 20 co-passenger satellites at 10:23 AM on February 28, ISRO stated. The launch will be the first one to mark the entry of private players in space after the Indian government brought in reforms in the space sector last year.
- The Brazilian satellite, which will be the primary one on board the 53rd PSLV mission, is an optical earth observation satellite of the National Institute for Space Research (INPE).
- ISRO's last mission was the successfull launch of communication satellite CMS-

01 on December 17. CMS-01 onboard the PSLV-C50 was ISRO's second launch during the COVID-19 pandemic and aimed at putting India's 42nd communications satellite in orbit.

Sputnik V vaccine shows 91.6% efficacy

- An interim analysis of a Phase-3 trial of Russia's Sputnik V vaccine against COVID-19 shows the vaccine is safe and has 91.6% efficacy.
- The 93.6% efficacy was seen 21 days after the first dose. Although the study was not designed to assess the efficacy of a single dose regimen, the researchers observed a possible partial protective effect of a single dose. The result were published in The Lancet.

- The total number of satellites launched till date is 328 from 33 different countries and the revenue earned till date is 25 million US dollars and 189 million Euros.

- Researchers from Indian Institute Technology, Madras (IIT-M), are working on a new idea that could pave the way for developing effective drugs for treating HIV/AIDS by using molecular dynamics simulations.
 - The results of their research were recently published in the peer-review Journal of the American Chemical Society - Biochemistry.
 - Current inhibitors that target HIVPR make use of the weak forces of attraction called 'van der Waal's forces' to attach themselves to the protease molecule. Given that these forces are weak, the efficacy of the drug is variable and the virus will soon become resistant to them.

Indian-American behind NASA rover's Mars landing

Indian-American scientist Swati Mohan, who

leads the guidance, navigation, and control operations of NASA's Mars 2020 mission, played a pivotal role in landing the U.S. space agency's historic Perseverance rover on the Martian surface.

Chandrayaan-3 launch

• Chandrayaan-3, India's third mission to Moon, is likely to be launched in 2022, ISRO chief K Sivan.

Sonam Wanghchuk, The Real-life Phunsukh Wanadu's Innovative Gift For Jawans in Ladakh

- Sonam Wanghchuk, the man behind the character of 'Phunsukh Wangdu' in the Bollywood blockbuster '3 Idiots' has found a solution to keep the Army jawans stationed in the Ladakh region warm. He has built a solarpowered portable military tent for the soldiers that could accommodate 10 jawans at a time. The weight of the tent, he claimed, is less than 30 kilos.
- The innovator and education reformist further said that the military tent could work even under sub-zero temperatures such as -14 degrees Celcius.

INCOIS to go for aerial mapping

 The Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS) is planning to take the help of the National Remote Sensing Centre (NRSC) for aerial mapping of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands and Lakshwadeep to get a better picture of the ocean floor, also called 'bathymetric' study.

- The 'Sri Sakthi Sat' satellite developed by the college students of Coimbatore for ISRO will be launched on February 28.
- Sri Shakthi College of Engineering and Technology is located on the L & T Bypass Road, Chinniyampalayam, Coimbatore. The college has developed a satellite called 'Sri Sakthi Sat' with its students.

Sri Shakthi Sat

- It is developed by the students of Sri Shakthi **Institute of Engineering and Technology**
- This is a nanosatellite that weighs only 460
- It will be launched under Indian National Space Promotion and Authorisation Centre called IN-SPACe.
- ISRO would launch the satellite developed by two other institutions from Chennai and Nagpur along with Sri Shakhthi satellite in its UNITYSat.

IISER Kolkata scientists simulate Mars on the computer

- Scientists from Indian Institution for Science Education and Research (IISER) Kolkata suggest that it was the planet's intrinsic magnetic dynamo which, by shielding its atmosphere from the sun's solar wind, protected its atmosphere. When the magnetic dynamo switched off, the atmosphere slowly was eroded by the solar wind and eventually vanished, leaving the thin remnant we see today. These results have been published in the journal Monthly Notices of the Royal Astronomical Society.
- The researchers build a computer model of a Marslike planet interacting with the plasma wind from a Sunlike star.

5.2 LATEST DISCOVERIES IN **HEALTH SCIENCE**

CMC did country's first successful Kidney transplant 50 years ago

- It has been 50 years since a team of doctors at the Christian Medical College (CMC) here performed the country's first successful kidney transplant. Since then, the departments of Urology and Nephrology of the CMC have performed 3,755 transplants and 188 deceased donor transplants.
- Mohan Rao, who was a surgeon at the CMC, recalled the incidents that led to the first transplant on February 2, 1971. In 1965 and 1966, there were three unsuccessful kidney transplantation attempts - two in Mumbai and one in Varanasi.

5.3 MASS MEDIA & COMMUNICATION

Govt orders internet shutdown in greas close to farmers protest sites in Delhi

- The government ordered shut down of internet services in parts of Delhi NCR amid protests by farmers in the national capital.
- invoked Government has Temporary (Public Suspension of Telecom Sevices Emergency or Public Safety) Rules, 2017 in the interest of maintaining public safety and averting public emergency to suspend internet services in areas closer to farmers protest sites.

TANGEDCO takes digital route for ease of business

- As a step towards ease of doing business for customers, Tangedco has launched an automation and steam-lining procedure to assign new services for both domestic (low tension) as well as industrial consumers (heigh tension) without much human intervention.
- Tangedco has finalized the procedure for making name transfer for electricity connections through online mode. The online facility for domestic consumers is proposed to be launched on April 1.

TANGEDCO

- Tamil Nadu Electricity Board (TNEB) was formed on July 1, 1957 under section 54 of the Electricity (Supply) Act 1948 for power generation, transmission and distribution.

CoWIN App

- CoWIN is a Grand Challenge to strengthen the COVID Vaccine Intelligence Network (CoWIN) system. CoWIN is a digital platform that can be used to effectively promote and expand the mechanism of the COVID vaccine distribution system nationwide.
- It was launched by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) and the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY).

Kerala's first human milk bank

- Health Minister K K Shailaja inaugurated the state's first human milk bank Nectar of Life at Ernakulam General Hospital via videoconferencing.
- 3,600 babies are born in the general hospital a year and out of those, 600 to 1,000 sick babies are admitted into the Neonatal intensive care unit (NICU). The breast milk from the bank will reduce the risk of infections and boost the immunity of the newborn babies.

Oxford names Aatmanirbharta as Hindi Word of 2020

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi's emphasis on Aatmanirbharta in the wake of the novel coronavirus pandemic, this particular word has been named by Oxford Languages as its Hindi Word of the Year 2020 as it validated the day-to-day achievements of the countless Indians who dealt with and survived the perils of a pandemic.
- Previous Hindi words of the year are Aadhar (2017), Nari Shakti (2018) and Samvidhaan (2019).

Ambitious BharatNet all set to be rolled out

- The 'BharatNet Project' will be rolled out to one-third of the revenue villages in Tamil Nadu by March 31, 2021, and to the remaining villages by November 30, 2021. This was announced by Governor Banwarilal Purohit in his customary address to the State Assembly.
- The Rs 1,815-crore project will benefit 12,524 villages, which will be connected through optical fiber network and will be provided with not less than 1 GBPS high speed network connectivity in each village.

Kiran Service Helpline

 The 'Kiran' service was set up by the Social Justice and Empowerment Ministry. The Kiran helpline (18005990019) of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD) of the Ministry was launched on September 7 by SJE Minister Thaawarchand Gehlot.

C-DAC

 Cybercrime investigations are set to scale new heights in Tamil Nadu with the State police identifying as many as 185 young subinspectors, mostly graduates in Electronics and Communications Engineering, hundreds of graduate police constables for deployment in cybercrime police stations in all cities/districts.

C-DAC

- C-DAC was created in November 1988, originally as the Centre for Development of Advanced Computing Technology (C-DACT).
- This was in response to issues purchasing supercomputers from foreign sources.
- Centre for Development of Advanced Computing (C-DAC) is the premier R&D organization of the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) for carrying out R&D in IT, Electronics and associated areas.

Koo App

- Koo is an app like Twitter which was launched on March 2020.
- It had won the Aatmanirbhar App challenge.

e-Chhawani portal for online civic services

 Defence Minister Rajnath Singh recently launched an online portal 'e-Chhawani' and mobile app, to facilitate 'ease of living' and 'ease of doing' for the residents of the Cantonment Boards across the country.  Jammu and Kashmir formally rolled out e-Kuber payments system of Reserve Bank of India (RBI). The system is capable of making 50,000 transactions at a time, while all government-related financial transactions would be dealt directly with RBI, without any intermediary bank.

Sandes App

 Sandes, which is the Indian government's instant messaging app, is now accessible to everyone. The app, which has been launched by the National Informatics Centre (NIC), gives a boost to PM Narendra Modi's Digital India and Aatmanirbhar Bharat (self-reliant India) initiative.

Centre likely to postpone Census to 2022

- The Centre is on track to push the 2021 Census to 2022 on account of the country's continuing pre-occupation with the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The Census exercise was to be conducted in two phases-House Listing and Housing Census from April to September 2020 and Population Enumeration from February 9 to February 28, 2021.
- The first phase of the Census and the updating of the National Population Register (NPR) were intially to be rolled out in some States on April 1, 2020, but were postponed due to the pandemic.

3-language policy is not applicable to Central govt. offices

- The Union Ministry of Home Affairs has announced that the three language policy is not applicable to offices of the Union government. The ministry gave this response to a question • Named as 'Vasuki', it covered the distance of filed under the Right to Information (RTI) Act on the recent CRPF event at Bhadravati in Shivamogga district, where the plaques unveiled to mark the foundation stone-laying ceremony were only in English and Hindi.
- The reply furnished by the ministry on January 29 stated that "as per the provision of the Official Language Act, 1963, and the Official Language Rules, 1976, the provision of bilingual policy is applicable in the offices of the Central government".
- Home Minister Amit Shah laid the foundation stone for the 97th battalion of the Rapid Action Force in Bhadravati on January 16.

India delivers 2 cranes for Chabahar

 In its latest push to develop Iran's Chabahar port project, India handed over two 140-tonne

- cranes for loading and unloading equipment to the Iranian government.
- The cranes, part of a full consignment of six Mobile Harbour Cranes (MHC) worth about \$25million were sourced from Italy and formally released at a ceremony at Chabahar's Shahid Beheshti port after official talks between India and Iran.
- India's plans to invest further in the port project are seen as an indicator that the government expects some easing up in U.S. sanctions in the upcoming months, once the new Biden administration begins to address its policy on <mark>re-en</mark>tering the Iran nuclear deal.

Vasuki Train

- The South-East Central Railways (SECR) zone in Chhattisgarh breaks its own previous record by successfully operating the longest ever freight train by amalgamating five rakes of goods trains as one unit of around 3.5 km.
- 224 km between the railway stations of Bhilai and Korba and took about seven hours.
- The 'Vasuki', comprising of 300 wagons of long haul rake of five goods trains, ran with the help of one pilot, one assistant loco pilot and a guard.
- The nation's most profitable railways zone SECR had earlier operated 177 loaded wagons "Super Anaconda" of 2 km long freight train on 29 June 2020, then connecting three goods trains using the latest technology of Distributed Power Control System (DPCS).

Textile Minister Smriti Irani inaugurates 8th India International Silk Fair

• The Union Textiles Minister Smriti Irani inaugurated the 8th India International Silk Fair on Virtual Portal on 31st January 2021.

- The five days event is being held on Indian Silk Export Promotion Council's virtual platform due to COVID-19 pandemic.
- The fair is considered to be India's biggest silk fair.
- More than 200 overseas buyers and equal number of their representatives in India are participating to interact with more than 100 renowned and big Indian companies manufacturing and trading silk and silk blended products.
- India is the only country in the world which produces all the four major varieties of silk, which are Mulberry, Eri, Tassar, and Muga.

Uttarakhand sets up Botanical Garden to conserve 210 species of trees of Shivalik range

- In Nainital district of Uttarakhand, a first of its kind botanical garden named 'Shivalik Arboretum' has been inaugurated, for conserving over 210 species of trees found in the Shivalik range of Himalayas.
- Shivalik Arboretum aims to spread nature education among people so that they are able to feel an emotional connect with the trees, and make them more active towards conservation.
- The facility will showcase information like scientific information about particular species, cultural significance, medicinal use, country of origin, type of habitat in which it is found and all possible uses including as timber, dyes or any other peculiar use.

Maharashtra tops 2nd India Justice Report for delivering justice to people

- Maharashtra has retained its top rank in the second edition of the India Justice Report -2020, which judges states in terms of delivery of justice to people.
- Maharashtra retained its number one position among 18 large and mid -sized states (where population is over one crore each).
- Tamil Nadu and Telangana were second and third respectively in the same category.
- Among the 7 small states (where the population is less than one crore each), Tripura has topped the list followed by Sikkim and Goa.

• The India Justice Report (IJR) is launched by Tata Trusts in collaboration Centre for Social Justice, Common Cause, Commonwealth Human Rights Initiative, DAKSH, TISS-Prayas, Vidhi Centre for Legal Policy and How India Lives.

Sports Minister Kiren Rijiju launches first Reference Material synthesized by NDTL and NIPER to strengthen antidoping measures

- The Union Minister of Youth Affairs & Sports Kiren Rijiju recently launched a Reference Material, for use in the anti-doping field for chemical testing.
- This RM is jointly synthesized by the National Dope Testing Laboratory (NDTL) and the National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education and Research (NIPER), Guwahati.

About RM

- This first-of-its kind RM is a rarely available substance globally and while testing of a sample, the RM will provide identity confirmation for prohibited substances which do not have threshold limits.
- This would be used to strengthen anti-doping measures in all World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) accredited labs.
- It is one of the 20 RMs, that will be produced by NDTL and NIPER-G.
- NDTL and NIPER-G had signed memorandum of understanding (MoU) in August 2020 to synthesize 20 rare RMs over three years.

'One Nation, One Ration Card' scheme in 32 states, UTs

- 'One Nation, One Ration Card' scheme of the Union Government is being implemented by 32 States and Union Territories, reaching about 69 crore beneficiaries, announced Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman while announcing the Union Budget.
- The Finance Minister informed that the scheme has covered 86 per cent of the beneficiaries, adding that the remaining four states and UTs will be integrated into the scheme.

India has highest number of new leprosy cases annually: WHO

- India needs to take special measures to ensure economic security for people with leprosy as situations like the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic have jolted the ostracised community, making them rely merely on handouts to survive.
- People with leprosy had been ignored during these trying times and not many had come forward to check on their well-being, Sasakawa, who was awarded the Gandhi Peace Prize in 2019 for his fight against leprosy, especially in India.
- According to the World Health Organisation (WHO), India has the highest number of new cases of leprosy in the world annually, followed by Brazil and Indonesia.
- India reported 1,35,485 new cases in 2016, which is 63 per cent of the 2,14,783 new cases reported globally.

First Ultraviolet ray to sanitize train coaches

- Lucknow Metro has become the first metro in India to use ultraviolet (UV) rays to sanitise train coaches, a senior official of the Lucknow Metro Rail Corporation (LMRC) said on Friday.
- For this, the LMRC has procured sanitization apparatus from M/s FB TECH, an Indian firm in Jaipur, Rajasthan.
- The Uttar Pradesh Metro Rail Corporation (UPMRC) has taken inspiration from the New York Metro's experiment to sanitise trains with UIV lamp rays.
- The apparatus, which was certified by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) in October 2020, sanitizes the entire coach in just seven minutes.

Parliament House: 100 Years Ago, On This Day, Foundation Stone Was Laid

- Exactly a hundred years ago, on 12th February, the foundation stone of Parliament House was laid. 26 years before India became Independent, Britain's Duke of Connaught laid the foundation stone and said it would stand "as the symbol of India's rebirth to yet higher destinies".
- The building, with a diameter of 560 ft and circumference of one-third of a mile, was designed by Sir Herbert Baker, who along with Sir Edwin Lutyens was chosen to design the new imperial capital in Delhi in the Raisina Hill area.
- The masterpiece, architectural was originally called Council House, was inaugurated six years later in 1927, 20 years before India attained its freedom on August 15, 1947, by then Viceroy, Lord Irwin.
- The sprawling edifice covering an area of nearly six acres and its creamy sandstone colonnade of 144 pillars on the first floor is one of the most distinctive parliament buildings anywhere in the world. In 1929, Bhagat Singh hurled a bomb into its chambers.

City's first Miyawaki forest

- As the first Miyawaki forest in Chennai turns one this week, the Greater Chennai Corporation wants the residents' associations to notify details about unused spaces in their neighbourhood for raising a similar forest.
- The Corporation aims at raising 1,000 such plantations. It has already raised Miyawaki forest in about 20 locations in the last one year in the city.
- The first Miyawaki forest was created in Kotturpuram near the MRTS station after clearing 1,600 tonnes of debris one year ago.

Govt. will form a Valaiyar Reclamation Board

- Tamilnadu Stated Government will take steps to establish a Valaiyar Reclamation Board, Chief Minister Edappadi K. Palaniswami.
- PM announce, the government was also taking steps to protect the memorials for the rulers of the Mutharaiyar community. The government, as announced in the Assembly, laid the foundation for the statue of Perarasar Perumbidugu Mutharaiyar in Tiruchi.
- The Mutharaiyar community members are mostly farmers who feed the people of the State.
- The government had introduced several pro-farmers schemes, including the 'kudimaramathu' scheme.

Operation Smile to rescue missing kids

A special camp Operation Smile aimed at rescuing missing children was inaugurated at Trichy railway junction. Superintendent of police, government railway police (GRP), Trichy T Senthilkumar proclaimed that the camp will be held under the jurisdiction of 24 government railway police (GRP) stations and six outposts in Trichy railway police limit from February 1 to 15.

Tamil Nadu drops disciplinary action and cases against govt employees, teachers

- Tamil Nadu chief minister Edappadi K Palaniswami announced dropping of disciplinary proceedings initiated against 7,898 government employees and teachers and 408 cases registered against 17,686 staff and teachers for holding indefinite protests in 2019.
- The government employees and teachers' associations held indefinite agitation in January last year urging a charter of demands, including pending 21-month arrears as per the Seventh Pay Commission recommendations, reverting to the old pension scheme, elimination of wage discrepancies, regular pay for all those under consolidated and special time scale pay and revoking a government order setting up staff rationalisation committee.

Metro Lite

• The Finance Minister added that the government will raise the share of public transport in urban areas through the expansion of the metro rail network and the city bus service will be strengthened. A new scheme will be launched at a cost of ₹ 18,000 crores to support the expansion of public bus transport services.

₹400 victims of sexual assault benefited from Thozhi scheme'

- City Police Commissioner Mahesh Kumar Aggarwal announced around 400 victims of sexual assault were given counselling and other support from women police personnel, who have been functioning under a scheme called 'Thozhi' in the city since its launch last year.
- 'Thozhi' was launched as a special wing last November to provide counselling to victims and their parents and guide them through legal procedures.

CM GIVES ₹75 lakh cheque to CIFF organisers

- The facility in the premises of the Tamil Nadu State Agricultural Marketing Board was jointly inaugurated by Gagandeep Singh Bedi, Tamil Nadu Agriculture Production Commissioner and M Angamuthu, Chairman of APEDA.
- APEDA has provided financial assistance to the State department of Agriculture and Marketing for setting up of common infrastructure facility (cold storage, sorting and grading facility) at Dindigul, Villupuram and Coimbatore districts to facilitate exports of fresh vegetables.

Supreme Court to examine plea against T.N.'s 69% quota in colleges, govt. jobs

- The Supreme Court agreed to examine a petition seeking an immediate stay on the implementation of a Tamil Nadu law that allows 69% quota in educational institutions and government jobs in the State.
- A three-judge Bench led by Justice Ashok Bhushan issued notice and gave the Tamil Nadu government two weeks to file its response to a

- writ petition filed by a student, C.V. Gayathri, through her father, S. Vaitheeswaran, challenging the constitutionality of the Tamil Backward Classes, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Reservation of seats in Educational Institutions and of appointments or posts in the Services under the State) Act of 1993.
- Section 4 of the Act provides 30% reservation to the Backward Classes, 20% for Most Backward Classes and de-notified communities, 18% for Scheduled Castes and 1% for Scheduled Tribes. Thus, a total of 69% reservation is provided.

TN BharatNet tender re-jigged in October 2020

- The Centre has not cancelled implementation of the ₹1,950-crore BharatNet project in Tamil Nadu but the tender was re-floated in October 2020, clarified Sanjay Dhotre, Minister of State for Communications, Education and Electronics and IT in the Rajya Sabha.
- The State government signed an MoU with Universal Service Obligation Fund and Bharat Broadband Network (BBNL) in 2017, for implementing the BharatNet project.

TANFINET

- State Legislative Assembly under Rule 110 that "BharatNet" scheme will be implemented in Tamil Nadu through State led model and a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) namely Tamil Nadu FibreNet Corporation (TANFINET) will be incorporated for the same.
- BharatNet project ensures connecting Gram Panchayat to block-level offices situated within the district.
- It was started on 14.7.2017.

Tamil Nadu to soon have five more airports being built under UDAN scheme

 Union Minister for Civil aviation Hardeeep Singh Puri told Rajaya Sabha (February 3) that five airports in Tamil Nadu – Salem, Neyveli, Vellore, Ramnad and Tanjore - are being built under the 'Ude Desh Ka Aam Naagrik' (UDAN) programme of the Modi government.

UDAN Scheme

- It was started on 2017 at Shimla, Himachal Pradesh.

 Tamil Nadu has become the 11th state in the country to successfully undertake the Public Distribution System (PDS) reforms stipulated by the Department of Expenditure.

CM unveils slew of infrastructure projects

- Chief Minister Edappadi K. Palaniswami unveiled several infrastructure projects via videoconference at the Secretariat.
- He also laid the foundation for several projects, including hospital buildings and a food park.
- He unveiled new buildings constructed for the Social Welfare Department at a total cost of over ₹ 25 crore.
- He launched the social media services of the '181' helpline set up under the Nirbhaya Fund Scheme.
- He laid the foundation for the construction of an office for the Commercial Taxes Department at Avalpoonthurai, near Modakkurichi, in Erode, at a cost of ₹14.3 crore
- The Chief Minister unveiled the foundation for a food park at the Gangaikondam SIPCOT in Tirunelveli district.

Nirbhaya Fund Scheme

• Nirbhaya Fund was announced by the Finance Minister in his 2013 budget speech, with Government contribution of Rs. 1000 crores for empowerment, safety and security of women and girl children. The fund is administered by Department of Economic Affairs of the finance ministry.

World Thirukkural Conference

- The Third World Thirukkural Conference will be held in Thanjavur for 3 consecutive days starting.
- The conference will be held on behalf of the World Tamil Research Institute, Government of Tamil Nadu, Thanjavur Bharat College of Science and Management, Australia Melbourne Tamil Association, Ilangadu Narthamilch Association, Thanjavur Tamil Thai Foundation.

• The conference was held at Thanjavur Bharat College of Science and Management.

Mettur surplus water scheme launched

• Chief Minister Edappadi K. Palaniswami announced 24-hour three¬ phase electricity supply would be provided to farm pumps from April 1.

Mettur Dam

• The Stanley Reservoir, Salem District, was opened in 1934 by Sir George Stanley, the then Governor of Madras. The Mettur Dam was constructed by the Madras Presidency Public Works Department to capture the water and create the Resevoir from the Cauvery River (now named Kaveri) where the river enters the plains.

Bill to provide 10.5% special quota to Vanniyars passed in Assembly

- Legislation to temporarily provide for 10.5% special reservation for the Vanniakula Kshatriyas within the quota for the Most Backward Classes (MBCs).
- The Bill provides for internal reservation for the MBCs and Denotified Communities. The Most Backward Class of the Vanniakula Kshatriyas will get 10.5%, the Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities 7% and the Most Backward Classes 2.5%. This quota will be created from within the 20% reservation for the Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities.
- This Act is based on the recommendations made by the committee led by Justice M.S. J.

Opening of Dr.J.Jayalalithaa University at Villupuram

- Dr.J.Jayalalithaa University has been opened in Villupuram.
- The Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu had announced in the Assembly that the university would be separated from Thiruvalluvar University and would be headed by Villupuram.

Bharat Net Project

- BharatNet is a flagship mission implemented by Bharat Broadband Network Ltd. (BBNL).
- It is a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) set up by the Government of India under the Companies Act, 1956 with an authorized capital of Rs 1000 crore.
- Initially, it was under the Ministry of Communications and Information Technology, which was bifurcated into the Ministry of Communications and the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology in July 2016.

 Currently, it is being implemented by the Department of Telecommunication under the Ministry of Communications. National Optical Fibre Network (NOFN) was launched in October 2011 and was renamed as Bharat Net Project in 2015.

Sitharaman inaugurates CCI"s south regional office in Chennai

- Union Minister Nirmala Sitharaman inaugurated Competition Commission of India"s (CCI) south regional office in Chennai.
- The regional office will cater to the requirements of Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and the union territories Puducherry and Lakshadweep.
- The Chennai Office of CCI will act as an office to facilitate enforcement, investigation, advocacy function in coordination with Delhi office.
